


HOLY NAME OF JESUS - 175th ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS – AUGUST 18-24, 2021




Wednesday, August 18 - 10 AM **Little Lourdes Day - Mass & Anointing**

VESPERS **August 21 & August 23 - 6:30 PM**


Vespers, otherwise known as "evening prayer" is the oldest and most important of the traditional liturgy of the hours, along with Lauds or "morning prayer." Vespers revolve around the Magnificat canticle, various psalms and antiphons, and readings that vary according to the liturgical season prayer. During these celebrations, we will be following the Common of the Dedication of a Church.

Vespers on Saturday, August 21 will be in Holy Name Church. On Monday, August 23 Vespers will be in the Haider Chapel at Calvary Cemetery. Please bring a folding chair if you want to sit. Parking is on 10th St. or North Ave. The space in front of the Chapel will be blocked off and for walking only.

Sunday, August 22 - 10:30 AM **Anniversary Mass with Bishop Schuerman**

On Sunday, August 22, current and past priests will concelebrate, with Bishop James Schuerman presiding at the culmination of the celebration of our 175th year of service to the Catholics of Sheboygan at the 10:30 am Mass. We will have full choir voices and the pomp and circumstance due this momentous occasion. Mass will be followed by a Eucharistic procession around the church block (*weather permitting*), led by the Knights of Columbus Council 722, concluding with Benediction. Light refreshments and snacks will be served on the East Lawn of Church.

Looking forward to continuing as the Rock on which His Church was Built, on Tuesday morning, August 24, we will celebrate a special morning Mass with music at 8 am. This is the actual day that the first Catholic Mass was held in Sheboygan 176 years ago.
